

Improving Pace of Play for Legends

WHILE WE'RE YOUNG!

IT IS NOT ABOUT HURRYING UP OR RUSHING AROUND
THE COURSE, IT IS SIMPLY ABOUT BEING MORE EFFICIENT

Play ready-golf throughout the entire round

“Tee Forward” -- consider moving up a Tee that better suits your game

If your ball might be lost or out of bounds, play a
provisional ball

Get your yardage and be ready to play before it is
your turn

When riding on a “cart-paths only” day, take several clubs and a ball
when walking to your ball

When riding on a cart, clean clubs and put clubs in bag at next shot
position

Be more efficient when riding with another player. Drive to the ball and
let your partner out then go to your ball

Place your cart or bag on path between green and
shortest distance to the next tee, not in front of the green

Read your putt before it is your turn to play

Player with ball closest to hole tends flag

If you are the first to putt out, pick up the flag

Record scores at next tee

The first person to the next hole should tee off (no priority for white
tees, birdies, or pars)

Don't hesitate to remind slower players that they are holding up the
group. It is everyone's responsibility to enforce pace of play
